Mr Moses Lee joined the Administrative Service in 1974 after graduating with a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) degree in Mechanical and Production Engineering from the University of Singapore on a President's Scholarship. He also has a Masters degree in Public Administration from Harvard University.

Mr Lee served in the Development Division (Ministry of Finance), Ministry of National Development, Ministry of the Environment and Ministry of Education before being appointed Principal Private Secretary to Prime Minister in 1987. Mr Lee was the General Manager of Singapore Broadcasting Corporation (SBC), from 1990 to 1994 and Deputy Chairman, Singapore International Media Pte Ltd from 1994 to 1995 after SBC's corporatisation in 1994. Mr Lee previously served as the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Health, former Ministry of Community Development, and former Ministry of Labour and has been the Commissioner of the Inland Revenue Authority of Singapore since 2005.
