HOW DOES THE GST INCREASE SUPPORT THE LOWER-INCOME?


The GST increase supports public spending, with more help given to the lower-income.

GST is payable when goods and services are consumed.

This means that those who spend more, pay more GST.



The Government uses GST revenue to help the lower-income.



The **GST Voucher** scheme gives help to lower- and middle-income Singaporeans to **offset part of their GST expenses**.

Assistance is given in the form of:






B MediSave top-ups for the elderly



C U-Save for eligible HDB households to offset utilities bills



The GST Voucher scheme and other social assistance schemes work hand in hand with GST.

An **offset package** will be implemented to help Singaporeans adjust to the GST increase. **More support** will be given to lower- and middle-income households to **cushion the impact of the increase**.
